The CERT program educates individuals nationwide on how to assist family, friends, neighbors and themselves in the event of a disaster. Also, CERT members assist their communities year-round at local events; in the aftermath of severe weather; or at any other venue where city leaders need the assistance of additional personnel.

The program includes training on disaster preparedness for hazards that may impact your area as well as teaches basic disaster response skills, such as fire safety, light search and rescue, team organization and disaster medical operations.

Training consists of eight, three-hour sessions and a drill.
