



Safe and Well Linking Fundamentals SWLFUND: September 2013 Fact Sheet: September 2013

### **Description**

Safe and Well Linking Fundamentals is a basic level, web-based course. The course provides an introduction to the tasks and responsibilities of Safe and Well Linking workers at a local response and a larger disaster relief operation.

Safe and Well Linking workers help people within the disaster area notify their loved ones to inform them they are safe, help reconnect people separated by the disaster, and search for missing people within the disaster area who have serious health or mental health conditions. Participants are required to take an assessment upon completion of the course and score at least an 80% to receive a certificate.

Note: Safe and Well Linking Fundamentals replaces the Safe and Well Linking Overview course (DIS000092).

### **Purpose**

The purpose of this course is to prepare participants to perform the Safe and Well Linking tasks in support of local disaster incidents such as single or multi-family house fires and during larger disaster relief operations.

## Learning Objectives

Upon completion of this course, participants will be able to:

- Describe the common tasks that Safe and Well Linking workers perform.
- Explain how to use the Safe and Well website.
- Explain how to handle Safe and Well Linking telephone inquiries.
- Explain how to resolve General Welfare Inquiries, Emergency Welfare Inquiries and Family Reunification Requests.
- Describe Red Cross rules regarding client privacy and worker etiquette.
- Describe how Safe and Well Linking works with other Red Cross activities and outside partners.

#### **Audience**

Individuals and organizations interested in assisting with Safe and Well Linking during a disaster response.

#### **Prerequisites**

Disaster Services: An Overview

#### Length

This course is self-paced and the completion time may differ among participants. It should take approximately 45 minutes to complete.
